City releases Sustainable Official Community Plan comprehensive online public survey

With stakeholder workshops wrapping up, Sustainable Campbell River continues to seek input from the community through an online survey available at www.sustainablecampbellriver.ca.

The comprehensive survey asks the public to prioritize issues in key areas, including the environment and protection of natural areas, renewable energy, transportation, agriculture, water management, social development and culture, economic development, housing and waste management.

Expressing the public survey's importance to the planning process, Mayor Charlie Cornfield states: "The next step in creating our community's vision is for the public to tell us which priorities are most important to them. The insight the public provides through the survey and other opportunities will allow us to achieve the best possible plan for our community's future."
