## **Water Wise Program Starts for Summer Season**

Summer weather is back, and along with this start of the season people in Campbell River will begin to see water cyclers.

This group of university students from Campbell River will spend the summer providing resources and advice to the community on how we can all be water wise outdoors during the driest time of year.

Some suggestions from the water cyclers include:

- Raise lawn mower blade heights to three inches (7.5 cm) to keep lawns greener with less water.
- Check soils to see if conditions can be improved for lawns to stay green with less watering.
- Adjust automatic sprinkling timers to water during off-peak periods and to avoid overwatering.
