## VANCOUVER ISLAND CLIMATE LEADERSHIP SUMMIT A SUCCESS Vancouver Island elected officials meet on Practical Solutions for Climate Action

(CAMPBELL RIVER) – Eleven mayors, councillors, and regional district directors from across Vancouver Island gathered in Campbell River on October 11<sup>th</sup> to map out how to work together to meet the targets each has to reduce energy consumption, greenhouse gas emissions, and ultimately save money in their communities around Vancouver Island.

"Climate action is simply the right thing to do. We shared practical experience on what climate action has worked on Vancouver Island," said Mayor Cornfield. Mayor Cornfield co-organized the event as part of his role as a member of the BC Mayors Climate Leadership Council.

Summit participants agreed to continue to share practical experience and to collaborate on exploring including the role of trees in climate action including conservation covenants, climate change adaptation, low speed electric vehicles and the human dimension of climate action. "It is really all about people," said Mayor Cornfield.

Several mayors, councilors, and regional directors were unable to attend the meeting but have expressed strong interest in ongoing involvement. The leaders in attendance agreed that they would like to continue to work collaboratively and to meet again in the spring when the Association of Vancouver Island and Coastal Communities has its annual general meeting.

The Vancouver Island Climate Leadership Summit was organized by Community Energy Association on behalf of the BC Mayors Climate Leadership Council with funding from the Pacific Institute for Climate Solutions (PICS) and Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation's BC Region. The BC Mayors Climate Leadership Council is composed of ten mayors from across BC who have stepped forward to assist and mentor other local government officials on climate action.

The Community Energy Association is a non-profit society that assists local governments on climate action.
