Project Overview

The Sybil Andrews Cottage was the home of Sybil Andrews and her husband Walter Morgan. In 2005, conceptual designs of the Highway 19A Upgrades in Willow Point were presented to the public and the plans did not include the retention of the cottage; as a result, the Sybil Andrews Heritage Society was formed and this group worked tirelessly to advocate for saving the cottage. In 2008, the cottage and property were placed on the City of Campbell River Community Heritage Register.

In 2010 Council approved the Sybil Andrews Cottage Restoration Project which included a complete restoration of the existing building and property on which the cottage is located.

The heritage restoration work was designed by Jonathan Yardley, with restoration services provided by 2 Hills Renovation Contractor.







Funding for the Project

The project was funded through the Heritage Legacy Fund, the Coast Sustainability Land Trust, the Sybil Andrews Heritage Society and the City of Campbell River. The total cost of design and construction for the restoration work was \$285,141. against an approved budget of \$315,000.
