

WILLOW POINT SPLASH PARK

On Time and On Budget!

Project Overview

Work under this project included the construction of a new splash park. This interactive play area features connections to Campbell River's marine heritage with marine themed elements including the killer whale mega soaker — a bowl full of water that fills and spills — the first of it's kind in B.C., and recognizes the efforts of the local fire fighters with water play including simulated fire fighter hose and nozzles.

The development of the Splash Park design was led by a combined effort culminating with input from local fire fighters, Campbell River Rotary, and the City, with input from the funding partners and the involvement of McElhanney Consulting Services of Campbell River in cooperation with the City. The park was delivered by RecTec industries with Upland Excavating Ltd., completing the necessary civil works.



Funding for the Project

Project funding was provided for by TELUS, the Rotary Clubs of Campbell River, Campbell River Professional Firefighters Association and the City's Parks Parcel Tax.

The total cost of the project was \$377,040 against an approved budget of \$378,200.
