Official Community Plan changes to Development Permit Area
Guidelines for Great Blue Herons/Bald Eagles/Steep Slopes

The City of Campbell River is updating the Development
Permit Area guidelines for Great Blue Heron nest trees,
Bald Eagle nest trees and steep slopes.

Changes are being made to slow habitat loss, improve
the clarity of the guidelines, and improve slope stability.

Corresponding updates are also being proposed for the
Environmental Protection Bylaw.

An online survey has been created based on the
proposed changes and a virtual meeting is scheduled
to give the public a chance to review and comment.
