

- AND WHEREAS** the Aboriginal peoples of Canada have made and continue to make valuable contributions to Canadian society, and it is considered appropriate that there be, in each year, a day to mark and celebrate these contributions;
- AND WHEREAS** many Aboriginal peoples celebrate the summer solstice, which has an important symbolism within their cultures;
- AND WHEREAS** the City of Campbell River will continue its efforts to strengthen partnerships with other levels of government, community organizations, as well as the public and private sectors, to honour and protect the rights of all Aboriginal Peoples.
