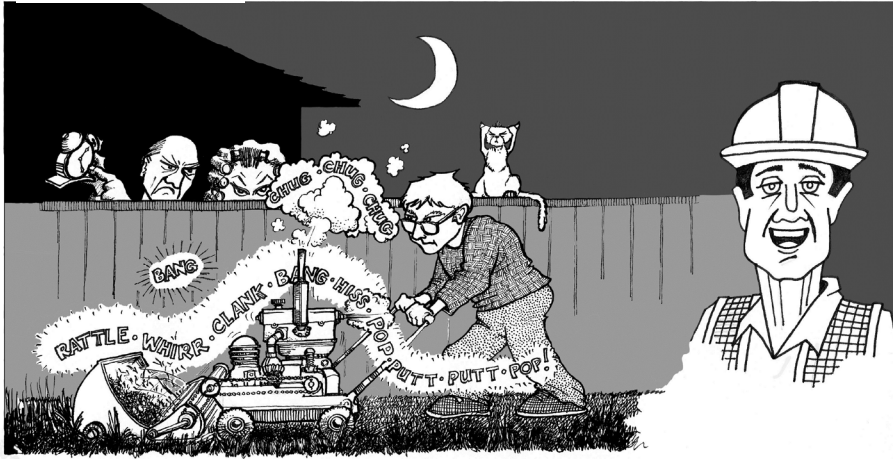

WATER, WATER EVERYWHERE!?

When you stop and reflect on our quality of life here in Campbell River, we all must admit we are extremely fortunate. Our City is a jewel set into the gorgeous coastline of Vancouver Island. Visitors from around the world remark on the beauty of our landscape and the richness of our ocean. However, all of our surroundings require care and stewardship to flourish. With much of our local industry and tourism being based on this natural splendor, it is absolutely vital that we maintain the health of our land and water.

Every summer, our community experiences heavy water-demand issues. While it does seem the lake chain is brimming with the glacial run-off we so enjoy, the City infrastructure is unable to disinfect a sufficient volume of water to meet the demand initiated by elevated temperatures and summer activities. Earlier this month the City enacted a watering ban as its ability to respond to fires and disasters was being compromised by household water users.

The largest culprit for water usage in the summer is irrigation. Sprinkler systems can use hundreds - if not thousands - of litres per day, and they are often overused in an effort to keep lawns green throughout the summer. Contrary to popular belief, only a small amount of water is required to maintain a healthy lawn (as little as 1 inch per week!), and the best way to keep it fresh and luscious is to raise your lawnmower blade to 3 inches.

PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

Notice is hereby given that a Public Hearing regarding the following will be held in the Council Chambers of City Hall located at 301 St. Ann's Road in Campbell River, B.C. at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, August 12, 2014. Property owners are required to provide all tenants, leaseholders and occupants with a copy of this Public Hearing Notice.

A copy of this proposed bylaw may be inspected at the City Hall, Development Services Department on any regular business day between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, from Thursday 31 July 2014 to Tuesday 12 August 2014. All persons who believe that their interests are affected by the proposed Bylaw will be afforded a reasonable opportunity to be heard or to present written submissions respecting matters contained in the Bylaw that is the subject of this hearing. Please note that legal considerations prevent Council from receiving any representations or submissions after the close of the Public Hearing. A speakers list will be available for persons wishing to speak at the Public Hearing. You may register in advance by calling 250-286-5700 or in person immediately before the Public Hearing. Prior registration is not essential to be able to speak at the Public Hearing, but is recommended.

Proposal for 1020 South Alder Street:

Bylaw No. 3560, 2014: To amend Zoning Bylaw 3250, 2006, to rezone the property from R-1 (Residential One) Zone and R-1B (Residential One B) to RM-1 (Residential Multiple One) Zone.
