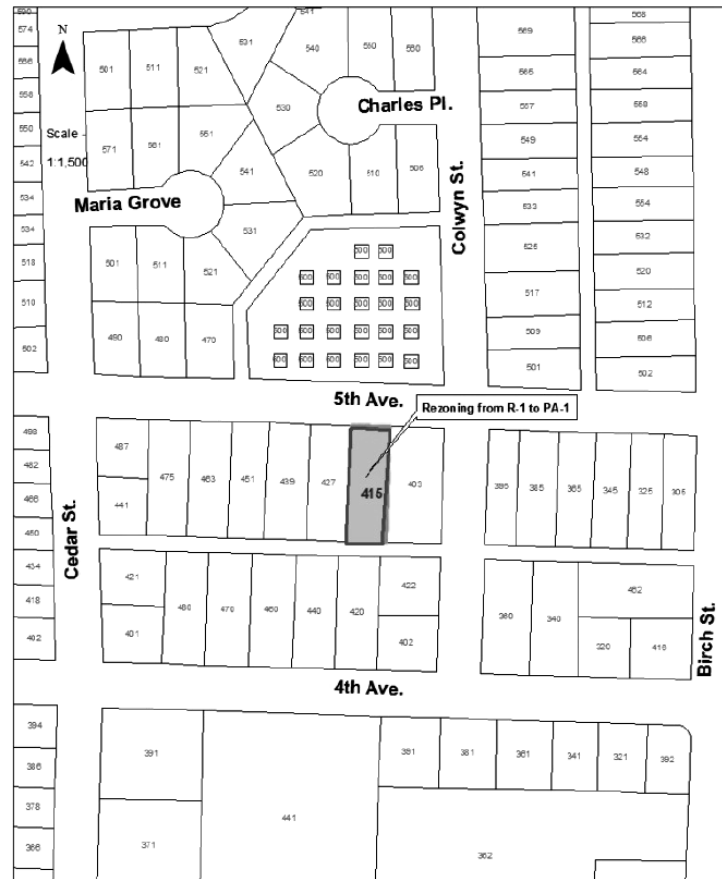
A copy of this proposed bylaw may be inspected at the City Hall, Community Planning & Development Services Department on any regular business day between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, from Thursday 8 October 2015 to Monday 19 October 2015. All persons who believe that their interests are affected by the proposed Bylaw will be afforded a reasonable opportunity to be heard or to present written submissions respecting matters contained in the Bylaw that is the subject of this hearing. Please note that legal considerations prevent Council from receiving any representations or submissions after the close of the Public Hearing. A speakers list will be available for persons wishing to speak at the Public Hearing. You may register in advance by calling 250-286-5700 or in person immediately before the Public Hearing. Prior registration is not essential to be able to speak at the Public Hearing, but is recommended.

Proposal for 415-5th Ave., by Campbell River Foursquare Church o/a Gateway Foursquare (City File ZON 15-037):

Bylaw No. 3591, 2015: To amend Zoning Bylaw 3250, 2006, to rezone the property located at 415-5th Ave. from Residential One (R-1) to Public Areas One (PA-1) to permit children's programming in connection with the existing church facility immediately east of this site.

The City of Campbell River's Airport Authority, a Commission of the City of Campbell River, oversees the operations of the Campbell River Airport on behalf of Mayor and Council. The City is currently seeking three (3) new volunteers to act as Members of the Airport Authority for a three-year term. Members of the Campbell River Airport Authority should have a commitment to excellence in policy governance and the skills, knowledge and experience necessary to carry out the duties of the Commission. The Commission is responsible for setting policy, monitoring outcomes and delivering to the Mayor and Council, as owners, the end results set by the Mayor and Council on behalf of the City. Bylaw 3444 establishes the Airport Authority. Candidates should be able to demonstrate knowledge and experience in the aviation industry, economic development, governance or governmental finance or operations. Positions are open to local and regional candidates. Interested persons should submit a brief resume and covering letter setting out how they could contribute to the role of Airport Authority Member. We thank all applicants for their interest; however only those candidates selected for an interview will be contacted. If you have applied in the past, you are still required to make a new application to be considered for this review process.

Every Bedroom Needs a Working Smoke Alarm!

Fire Prevention Week Oct. 4-10, 2015

Half of home fire deaths happen between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m., when most people are asleep.



For the best protection, install interconnected smoke alarms in your home. When one sounds, they all sound.

Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home, including the basement. Larger homes may need more alarms.



Test alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.



Some people, especially children and older adults, may need help to wake up. Make sure someone will wake them if the smoke alarm sounds.



Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or if they do not sound when tested.



When the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside. Go to your outside meeting place.



Call the fire department from a cellphone or a neighbor's phone. Stay outside until the fire department says it's safe to go back inside.
