Hundreds of people are expected to come to Campbell River again this May for a unique opportunity to celebrate fibre arts.

Vancouver Island Fibre Fest draws people from all over British Columbia, Alberta and Washington for spinning, weaving, knitting, felting, quilting, embroidery and more.

Last year, approximately 600 people attended to take in the three fun-filled days of workshops, free demonstrations and Marketplace shopping.
