## Busted! Three young offenders caught in the act, fined \$1,500 for graffiti

Three young offenders were observed tagging by a City bylaw enforcement officer this month and have been fined.

"The City's bylaw enforcement officer was out on another call and observed the three underage males heading for a known graffiti area. When he followed, all three were observed actively tagging a well-marked retaining wall adjacent to a public area," explains City clerk Peter Wipper. "The quick-thinking officer got photos and videos of the taggers and called the RCMP."

Police attended the scene, apprehended all three, and \$1,500 in fines have been issued.

The tagging occurred on private property along the South Island Highway, and the City is working with the property owner to have the graffiti removed.

"With the milder weather, we have seen a recent spike in graffiti files that have been keeping both RCMP and bylaw officers busy," Wipper adds.

"Graffiti and tagging offences are always of concern to the police, and the Campbell River detachment works closely with our partner agencies to follow up on and coordinate information gathered on these types of offence," says Staff Sergeant Troy Beauregard. "There is zero tolerance for tagging and accordingly, as in this instance, offenders will face charges."
