

Q & A: Watermain Replacement Projects

The City of Campbell River is commencing with the 2020 watermain replacement project. The following Questions and Answers are intended to provide an overview of the projects.

1. What is the project?

Work under these projects consists of installing new watermains and domestic services at several locations throughout Campbell River over a three year period. The existing services are connected to old, and/or undersized watermains which have reached the end of their useful service life.



2. Where are the project locations?

The locations for this work are:

- Fir Street between 9th and 12th Avenue - completed in 2019
- Garfield/Pengelley/Painter Roads - completed in 2019
- Hilchey Road Phase1 (Galerno to Penfield) 2020
- Hilchey Road Phase 2 (Hwy 19A to Galerno to be confirmed) 2021

3. What is the cost of the project?

The final cost of the Hilchey Road construction will be known once the contract has been awarded.

4. How is the project being funded?

Budget was approved in the 2020 Capital Plan and is funded by water reserves.

5. Who will be involved in the project?

The work is being completed under a design-bid-build model. Design was completed by the City's Capital Works and Water Departments. The construction contractor will be announced after the contract has been awarded.

6. When is the construction work going to take place?

The tender for construction on Hilchey Road is anticipated to be posted on the City's bid opportunities webpage this spring and construction to commence shortly after.

7. How will traffic be managed during construction?

Traffic management during construction will be the responsibility of the contractor doing the work. More details about traffic interruptions will be communicated through a resident newsletter to the area residents prior to the work commencing and on our project page.

8. How will the Provincial Health Officers orders be met?

To stop the spread of COVID-19, the contractor performing the work will need to comply with the PHO's orders and provide documentation to the city on how they can achieve these requirements safely.
