What is changing?

Starting May 19, 2014, a broader range of materials will be accepted in the curbside blue box for recycling. Here's a complete list:

Note: An unlimited number of blue boxes may be placed at the curbside for weekly collection, as long as each container is no more than 68 Litres or 20 kg.
