Q & A: Lift Station Generators Upgrade Project

In the spring of 2018 the City is anticipating that construction will start on the Lift Station Generators Upgrade Project. The following questions and answers are intended to provide an overview of the project.

1. What is the project?

Work under this project includes a select number of existing lift stations to be serviced with an appropriately sized stand-by generator at each site. Each site does not currently have a backup power source to service the affected sanitary sewer pumping and control systems during power outages. Through this upgrade to backup generators, the selected lift stations will be able to maintain continuous sewage flows during a power outage.

2. Where is the project?

The lift stations receiving the new generators are:

- No. 9 on Ocean Grove Road
- No. 10 at the Maritime Heritage Centre
- No. 12 on Detweiler Road
- No. 14 on Antonelli Road
- No. 15 on Quinsam Road

3. When is the construction work going to take place?

Construction is anticipated to begin in the spring and be completed by late June 2018.

4. What is the cost of the project?

The construction tender has been awarded in the amount of \$252,000. Budget was approved in the City's 2018 Capital Plan.

5. Who has been involved in developing the plans?

In March 2016, RPF 15-81 for design services was awarded to RB Engineering Ltd.

6. Who will be constructing the work?

The construction contract was publicly tendered, approved and awarded to Apple Electric Ltd. by City Council.

7. How will traffic be managed during construction?

Traffic management during construction will be the responsibility of the contractor doing the work. It is anticipated that the construction activities will be limited to each site.
