

ADVISORY: Construction crews mobilizing this week

As a resident in the area, you've likely seen crews preparing to start the in-water work at the Big Rock Boat Ramp. The ramp is now closed and work will continue through September, with the project wrapping up in October.

The final results of these upgrades will bring improvements to the breakwaters and ramp area, as well as a new floating dock system. Work is set to start on the breakwaters first (June-July), and wrap up with the floating dock/ramp at the end of August. September will see all final steps completed and demobilization of the site.

The project team is committed to reducing the impacts of this work as much as possible and will continue to keep you informed as the project progresses.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:

- The most immediate work will involve bringing loads of gravel onto the site, requiring a high degree of truck traffic particularly in this beginning period.
- You may notice members of the construction team accessing the parking lot area at the Husky gas station this is where the project office will be based for the duration of the work.
- There are no expected road closures as a result of this work.
- The seawalk route along the waterfront will remain open during the construction period, and flaggers will be on hand to make sure the path's crossing is safe for pedestrians.
- The project offers a critical upgrade that will allow Campbell River's boaters and anglers to launch safely for years to come.

CONSTRUCTION NOISE

Construction work will inevitably cause disruptions. As residents and business owners in the area, we want to make sure you're prepared for what to expect in the months to come, in particular around noise.

Work Hours

Construction is expected to happen between 7am - 7pm seven days/week. There will be short periods (July 7-12 & 20-23) when work may start earlier (6am) to accommodate necessary work during low tides.

Steel Pile Installation

As work begins on the floating dock, crews will be installing 8 steel piles in the ground. This will be the most noise-disruptive work and is expected to take place in early July. This work will occur during regular work hours.
