On Time and On Budget!

Project Overview

The project scope included modifications to the park that was to include improved access to the marine environment. During the detailed design phase the project team was faced with understanding and applying the new Provincial Guidelines for addressing expected impacts of sea level rise. The resulting impacts caused City Council to reconsider the timing of this project and to defer its completion until potential impacts of sea level rise are more completely understood.

While a revised design plan is in development, the City used some of the already-budgeted Ostler Park project funding for a short-term repair on the existing riprap (armouring with large boulders) along the shore to minimize storm damage to the seawalk, park furniture and plantings. Riprap or armouring the shoreline is a commonly used method for protecting the foreshore from the ocean environment and is the current method used for protecting City infrastructure at this location.

Funding for the Project

Funding of \$68,000 was provided by the Community Works Fund, Parks Reserve and Facilities Reserve. The project was completed on time and on budget.
