WATERFRONT SEWER UPGRADES COMPLETE

Five months after crews started construction on Phase 1 of the Waterfront Sewer Project, work is now complete – marking an important milestone in the city’s three-year Waterfront Project 2018-2020.

Installation of a new gravity main, from the Maritime Heritage Centre to 1st Avenue, began in early July, at the parking lot of the Maritime Heritage Centre, where a tie-in to the existing sewer main is located.

In November, crews reached 1st Ave. and work wrapped on the highway, followed by a final month of work in a right-of-way behind S. Murphy St to complete tie-in work.

To keep the highway open as much as possible and reduce traffic impacts during this work, interim paving was completed as the road work progressed. That paving will remain in place over the winter, and will be replaced in the Spring 2019. Stay tuned for an update on this in the new year.

This new infrastructure will help ensure protection of the City’s waterfront, and expand system capacity to accommodate community growth, particularly in the Willow Point and Jubilee Heights areas.

Plans for the next steps in the Waterfront Project 2018-2020 are coming together, with some updates to the original project schedule. To learn more about next steps and plans for 2019, see page 2.

PHASE 3A: 2019

PHASE 3B: 2020

Area: 1 km – 300 m south of Rockland Road to the southern limit of Big Rock Boat Ramp



- The aesthetics of the upgraded Hwy. 19A through Willow Point will be extended north by roughly 1 km, adding centre medians, underground services and upgrading the walkway.
- Part of the highway upgrades will also include the installation of a roundabout at Rockland Road. Watch for details to come.

In-water improvements



- The popular community facility is now reopened to the public with improved breakwaters, a refinished ramp, new floating dock system and additional parking.
- Damage to the walkway is being assessed and the City is considering plans for long-term protection.

1st Ave to Maritime Heritage Centre



- Phase 2 of the Waterfront Sewer Project will extend the new sewer installation from 1st Avenue to south of the Big Rock Boat Ramp. While this work was originally scheduled for 2020, the project team is looking to move it up to 2019, in order to keep construction progressing and reduce the cumulative impact of work in 2020.
- The last part of this work, scheduled for 2020, will include construction of a new lift station behind the Anchor Inn, and the replacement of two existing lift stations (No. 5 and No. 6) located on the South Island Highway near Rotary Park and the Big Rock Boat Ramp.
