





Concept A: Interactive Journey

Scale 1:300

Concept A envisions Frank James Park as an interactive waterfront journey. The Seawalk is punctuated by art elements, carving features, and beach accesses and viewpoints. The existing event lawn is maintained, but improved with upgraded and irrigated lawn that provides space for carving, seating, and other activities. The Seawalk is updated, following a similar route as existing, and a new trail provides an interpretive storyline about Sybil Andrews and Water Morgan as it passes the cottage. A gazebo and smallscale celebration area is introduced in the quiet northeast corner of the park, ideal for ceremonies like weddings and the Day of Mourning ceremony.

Concept B: Activity Destination

Scale 1:300

Concept B envisions Frank James Park as a waterfront destination with multi-use open spaces and a more urban feel. The plaza accommodates a range of events and activities, including Transformations on the Shore, while doubling as an informal space for relaxing and enjoying waterfront views. A low park edge feature is introduced at the street to diminish traffic and noise impacts, with the goal of creating a calmer, quieter park experience, while maintaining views into the park. The Seawalk continues to provide a waterfront promenade and is updated and extended along the park's waterfront with improved access to the shore and viewpoints emphasized along the journey. The Sybil Andrews Art Walk incorporates Sybil's art work directly into the Seawalk, drawing attention to the unique heritage site.




