affecting an estimated 55,000 to 75,000 Canadians and 8,000 British

Columbians;

and even paralysis;

AND WHEREAS there is no known cause of, prevention or cure for Multiple Sclerosis;

national voluntary organization in Canada that supports both MS research

and services for people with MS and their families:
