KEEP KIDS SAFE BACK TO SCHOOLTIPS FOR EVERYONE

With children heading back to school, the City, the school district and RCMP are asking drivers, cyclists and parents to watch out for kids along roadways.

Here are some safety tips for children walking to school with or without parents:

- Only cross the street at an intersection and use a route where the school has placed crossing guards.
- Parents should walk young children to school for at least the first week to ensure they follow a safe route.
- Parents should also accompany children taking new routes or attending new schools.
- Arrange to walk to school with a friend or classmate.

For parents dropping off children by car:

- Don't double park; it blocks visibility for other children and vehicles.
- Don't load or unload children across the street from the school.
- Always make sure your children exit the car on the side closest to the sidewalk.
- Never allow a child to cross mid-block.
- Arrange carpools with other families and neighbours to reduce the number of vehicles at the school.
