Third session of City's free building and land development forum Sept. 19

The next in a series of one-hour lunch 'n' learn sessions for local builders and developers will occur Sept. 19, with a focus on storm, sanitary and water services and soil deposition.

The discussion will offer an opportunity for feedback on proposed changes to how people can change their lot elevation and current practices for installation of water meters, inspection chambers, backyard ditch filling, as well as an overview on Statutory Rights of Way (SRWs).

"We invite people associated with the building and land development industry to join us for these educational and interactive sessions," says Ross Blackwell, the City's Land Use Services Manager. *"This is an opportunity to hear their feedback as well as a chance for us to share relevant information with them."*

The sessions continue to be held the third Wednesday of every month.

October 17 – Subdivision costs and requirements (including development cost charges, frontage improvements and environmental concerns)

November 21 – Building bonds, building inspections (perimeter drains, rain water leaders, emulsions application, framing and reading truss specifications, plumbing, insulations and requirements for occupancy and final permits)

December 19 – City Permits (hydrants, road closure, plumbing, building, etc.)

Seating is limited. Local industry professionals are reminded to bring their own brown bag, and reserve a spot by calling the City of Campbell River at 250-286-5725. The third session is scheduled for noon, Wednesday, Sept. 19 in the Rivercorp boardroom beside City Hall.
