SERVICE UPGRADE WORK MOVING AHEAD

Through the summer, pipe installation will proceed from Rockland Road to 1st Avenue.

After spending weeks on preparation through the corridor, crews are now installing the new forcemain and work is progressing northward. In lead-up to the pipe installation, there was a lot of work to do, including:

- **Completing 100+ Locates**: Digging down to confirm location and size of old and current services, as well as ground conditions.
- Finalizing Plans: For working around the above findings.
- **Opening Up the Route:** Moving any other infrastructure that is in the way of the new pipeline.
- **Relocating Existing Storm Water Outfalls:** To avoid conflicts with the new pipeline.

While you may have noticed work happening all over the construction route since June, it will now move in a more linear way from south to north. Work will continue through the summer with a target of reaching the end of the route in October.

This year's work includes the installation of a new, larger sewer pipe between Rockland Road and 1st Avenue and a new water main from the Big Rock Boat Ramp to Rockland Road. The highway will remain open during construction, with changes to traffic flows as necessary (see page 2 for more on traffic management).

We understand this work will be disruptive at times, and we are committed to reducing that disruption by sharing regular updates about the work to come. Watch for these news bulletins (to be provided monthly) and updates on social media, the project's webpage, radio notices and signage.

HIGHWAY 19A TRAFFIC UPDATES

Wondering what to expect when travelling along the waterfront this summer? Here are some quick updates and reminders for drivers planning to take the scenic route:

New: Single Lane Alternating Traffic

Over the last few weeks crews having been busy preparing for the start of work by assessing ground conditions between Rockland Road and 1st Avenue. During this preparation, crews found that the underground conditions required a change to original plans. As a result, the new forcemain alignment will have to shift approximately 1-2m westward, moving it from the edge of the asphalt into the northbound lane.

This shift reduces the footprint available to the contractor, requiring a single lane closure along the route during work hours. Thank you for your patience as we adjust to complete this important work.

We estimate that single lane alternating traffic will be in place for approximately four weeks beginning in mid-July. The road will be reopened to two-way traffic each night and weekend.

WATERFRONT BUSINESSES ARE OPEN!

Though drivers may experience some delays between Rockland Road and 1st Avenue during construction, Highway 19A is open, and so are the area's waterfront businesses.

Help reduce the impacts of this work by supporting businesses in the area. Make a stop along our beautiful waterfront for a walk and a meal, road trip supplies or even an overnight stay – we know it will be worth the wait.

30KM/HR Construction Zone

A reminder to travel carefully through the construction zone – watch for signage, traffic controllers and pedestrians/cyclists and **slow down to 30km/hr**. Lower speed limits help keep everyone safe and the project on schedule.
