The City is getting ready to commence with the expansion of the municipal broadband network. The following questions and answers are intended to provide an overview of the project.



Municipal Broadband Network

1. What is the project?

Work under this project includes the expansion of the City's municipal broadband network in the downtown core. Micro-duct conduit and broadband fibre is being installed to allow for increased opportunity to access the City's CRadvantage program.

2. Where is the project?

The project area for this work is on 10th Avenue between Alder and Beech streets.

3. When is the construction work going to take place?

Construction is expected to commence in early June and be complete by the end of June.

4. What is the cost of the project?

The approved budget for this installation is \$133,000.

5. How is the project being funded?

The project was approved in the 2021 Capital Plan and is funded by the Community Works Fund.

6. Who will be involved in the project design and construction?

The civil design work was completed by the City's Capital Works Department and an agreement for construction is in place with Lite Access Technologies who will be completing the installation.

7. How will traffic be managed during construction?

This project requires a single lane closure and restrictions to parking, including the temporary reduction of parking stalls in the City owned lot at 325 Beech Street. The contractor will be required to maintain appropriate traffic control throughout the course of construction and ensure driveway access is maintained at all times.
