

Waterfront Sewer Project Project Complete Summer 2021

AGING SEWER LINE GETS NEW LIFE

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The waterfront sewer forcemain, originally built in 1972, is a critical piece of infrastructure that required replacement to support new growth in the community and help protect the waterfront. This project is now complete after three years of construction.

This upgrade included the installation of a new, larger sewer forcemain along with the construction of three new lift stations:

PART 1: From Maritime Heritage Centre to 1st Ave. was completed in 2018.

PART 2: From First Avenue to Rockland Road - was completed in 2019-2020.

LIFT STATIONS: The lift stations were constructed 2020-2021.

In 2019, an archeological site was discovered as part of the excavating. The project team was able to reorganize the project plan and complete the work on time.
