



#### **Campbell River Fire Department History**

Prior to 1942, residents of Campbell River had no fire protection whatsoever. If a dwelling or business establishment caught fire, the only means of combating the blaze was the good old bucket brigade, handled by willing and sympathetic neighbours.

In 1941, during World War2, Corporal Milton "Mac" MacAlpine of the then B.C. Provincial Police, and Allan Bunting, who headed the A.R.P. in this district, approached Oscar Thulin with the idea of forming some sort of organized fire protection in Campbell River.

In December 1941 work commenced on the building of Campbell River's first fire truck. A 1935 Maple Leaftruck was obtained from the Campbell River Garage, and with the help of the men who worked at the garage, the truck took shape. As no metal could be purchased for a tank, old oil drums were cut in half and welded together to form an 850 gallon water tank. The tank was mounted on the truck body and two pumps scrounged and mounted on the chassis. Twelve hundred feet of 1 1/2" A.R.P. hose and a minimum amount of equipment resulted in the truck coming into service in April, 1942. After many hours of labour, donations of material, plain inaenuity and dedication, the Campbell River Volunteer Fire Department was formed.

On April 1, 1942 Mr. Thulin was assigned as Fire Chief by the A.R.P. Oscar Thulin, Chief; Carol O. Thulin, Ass't Chief; Clarence Thulin, Chief Engineer; Carl (Tubby) Thulin Jr., Ist Lieut.; Clyde Malbon, Capt.; Jock McKay, 2nd Engineer; Jim Haigh, 3rd Driver; with Jack Case, Fred King and Ted Idiens all Hosemen. All but three of these men had worked on the truck. The only woman member was Agnes Thulin, wife of the Chief, better known to the crew as "The Whistlepunk". She was a member since the department's inception and handled the communications end of the service.

Prior to the forming of the Fire Protection District in 1945, the sum of \$1,273 was raised by 40 donors towards building of a sorely needed hall. The first annual Fireman's Ball on November 18, 1944 raised \$268.00 towards the building of the hall. The necessary and valuable piece of property, a corner lot, was originally donated by Oscar Thulin, though after the Fire District was incorporated he received a small remuneration for the lot. December 17, 1944 the firemen went to work again, this time on building. The last record of volunteer labour, which totalled 960 hours, was October 14, 1945. Other than the Volunteer Firemen, only two local residents donated their time to the building of the Fire Hall. The three main doors were donated by Mrs. Mary Thulin and family in memory of Charles Thulin and Fred Thulin. Their memory was commemorated by brass plaques fixed to the doors.

It should be mentioned at this time, that between April, 1942 and October, 1945 the fire truck and equipment were housed at the Campbell River Garage which was owned by Chief Thulin and Einar Andersen. Although he was never a member of the Volunteer Fire Department, Mr. Andersen contributed financially during the first years of the Fire Department.

With this brief introduction, which does not dojustice to these men, we will review the following years.

It was during this period that the Campbell River Board of Trade initiated a drive for the purchase of an ambulance. When the Hallwas put into operation the firemen took over the ambulance and operated it until such time as circumstances forced them to relinquish this added service to the community.

In 1946 a near drowning spotlighted the need for an Inhalator, and Const. MacAlpine started a drive to raise funds from the citizens for the purchase of one.

The old method of ringing the telephone operator, who in turn roused the volunteers, aroused the need for a better alarm system, so in keeping in mind the eventual need for fire alarm boxes, the Gamewell System was installed in 1950.

Once on the road all communications were by two-way radio. The main set in the Hall was handled by the dispatcher.

In 1950 an E & J Resuscitator was purchased to bring the life saving equipment up to modern standards, and the monies for this was raised by the Volunteers holding a Tag Day.

The tenth anniversary of the Department saw the completion of the Hall by lining the upstairs and decorating the inside. This work was also done by volunteers.

**February, 1954** was a very special month for the department in as much as a new fire truck was purchased from Bickle Seagrave Co., Woodstock, Ontario.

The year 1955 saw the Chief and Volunteers once again going to work to build another piece of equipment. This time it was a 3 ton truck with a 1050 gallon water tank. Also in 1955, the boys built, from plans in a Popular Mechanics magazine, an Iron Lung, and it was a real feather in their caps when CBUT Television Station sent a photographer to Campbell River to film the lung in action.

1957 saw the installation of an electric hose dryer, which did away with the old method of laying hose out on a long platform to dry for long periods of time. It also saw the purchase of a new King Seagrave 625 G.P.M. pumper, equipped with 1200 feet of 2 1/2" hose and 600 feet of 1 1/2" hose, auxiliary lighting plant with flood lights, and an auxiliary portable pump.

Campbell River is growing and in March, 1960 the Department took over another obligation, and that

was a new ambulance which was purchased by the Campbell River and District Ambulance Association. The Association chose a **1960** International Travelall and equipped it with a stretcher, oxygen and first aid equipment.

**September, 1962** saw the opening ceremonies of the Training Tower built behind the Fire Hall.

1963 was one of the most disastrous years fire wise for Campbell River. In January, firefighters and equipment were taxed to the limit when the Willows Hotel burned to the ground. Then in October there was a boiler room explosion at Elk Falls Mill.

The Fire Department celebrated 22 years of service in **May**, **1964** with the delivery of a new Pierre Thibault pumper.

In **July, 1965**, Chief Thulin stated that the Fire Department needed more paid men to carry the load of ambulance calls. Three more paid men were hired in **February, 1966**.

**October 1, 1965** saw the end of an era when Chief Oscar Thulin retired after 23 years service to the Fire Department. It was his ingenuity and dedication that started the Campbell River Fire Department. He was replaced by W.J.D. McIntosh from Kitimat.

Muscular Dystrophy became a concern of the Campbell River Fire Department and in 1968 the annual Firefighter's M.D. Bingo started and since then thousands of dollars have been raised in Campbell River to help fight this disease.

In **December, 1968** the Campbell River Fire Protection District acquired another Fire Hall when the Willow Point waterworks voted to turn the Willow Point Fire Department over to Campbell River. In **August, 1971**, after the rescue of a swimmer who had fallen to the bottom of Elk Falls Canyon, the Department realized that a rescue type vehicle was needed in Campbell River.

Again, true to tradition, the Volunteer Firefighters went to work. They purchased a 1964 Ford 3/4 ton walk-in van for \$650.00. The van, although basically sound, required extensive repair work. On **April 22**, **1972** after 893 man hours, the project was completed and the vehicle was turned over to the Trustees of the Fire Department for the use as a Fire Service Rescue Van.

In **October, 1976** the new King 85' aerial platform fire truck arrived in Campbell River. The Class A 1050 gallon pumper carries a limited capacity of 250 gallons of water.

**Summer, 1978** saw the completion of Campbell River's new Fire Hall. The old Hall had housed the Fire Department for 33 years.

**July, 1978** the Campbell River Fire Department consists of a Fire Chief, Assistant Chief, a Paid Staff of: 4 Lieutenants and 13 Firefighters; a Volunteer Staff of: 18 Firefighters in No. 1 Hall and 26 Firefighters in No. 2 Hall including a District Chief; a total of 12 pieces of equipment and 2 ambulances.

The 1980s brought many changes to Campbell

River and to our Fire Department. A full time inspector and a full time mechanic were added to our staff. We took delivery of a Superior 1050 pumper in 1981 and continually upgraded equipment. In 1984 our new style of Turnout Gear was introduced. Out went the long black coats and hip boots!

The **80's** also brought a full time inspector and a full time mechanic to our staff.

One of the significant changes in this time, was the return of the wood stove. We estimate 5,000 of these stoves were installed in the **1980s**. Chimney fires averaged 150 per year.

In **1980** the Ross home in Oyster Bay burned and in **1982** a residence on Thulin Street was destroyed resulting in a death.

1983 saw the emergence of lawsuits to this Fire Department when the Anchor Autobody, Crane Supply fire took place. New Years Eve there were 9 boats destroyed at Fresh Water Marina.

One generator burn at the John Hart Generating Plant in **1984**, and there was a fire at McPhee Supply building on Spruce Street.

1985 was one of the busiest years with the Skyline Motel fire, the Finch Road Urban Interface fire, a death in a trailer in Shellbourne Trailer Court. The most significant fire in 1985 was the Painter's Lodge fire on December 24.

The burning trend continued into 1986 with several major fires. The Madison Apartment burned on DogwoodStreet. Award in the Hospital was severely damaged by fire. Tyee Apartment on 16th Avenue had 2 suites destroyed in December and 1 week later, December 14, we assisted Oyster River with the fire at The Gourmet by the Sea.

1987 placed the new 1250 G.P.M/ Pumper Mack into service in No. 1 Station and a formal contract with Emergency Health Services Commission was signed for the continuation of the provision of Ambulance Service.

1988 brought about the retirement of the Assistant Chief David Proctor with 27 years service and Fire Chief W.J. (Bill) MacIntosh, with 23 years of service. Doug Orser was appointed Fire Chief at this time, along with George Tait as Deputy Chief and L. Lundrigan as Assistant Chief.

In 1989 an additional Fire Prevention Officer and four dispatchers were hired, releasing one additional firefighter to respond with on first alarms. An upgrading of Department Radio system commenced.

1992 has brought some major changes in the Fire Department, with the loss of the contract with the government for the ambulance service and Assistant Fire Chief L. Lundrigan retired with 26 1/2 years of service. We look forward to the arrival of a new pumper truck. Its anticipated arrival is in the fall of 1992 or the spring of 1993.





### CAMPBELL RIVER CITIZEN Bronze Life Saving Medal

In a situation such as a fire many times ordinary people show great courage in the face of danger, such a person is Murray Grant. Murray Grant was awarded the Bronze Life Saving Medal, by St. John Ambulance at Government House, Victoria, B.C. on May 2, 1992.

### CAMPBELL RIVER FIREFIGHTERS Helping in Disaster Situations

On June 30,1984 the Alaska Cruise Ship the M.V. Sundancer struck a rock near the entrance to Seymour Narrows north of Campbell River, B.C. The accident occurred about 11:45 p.m. The 17,000 ton vessel limped to the Elk Falls Paper Mill pier in Duncan Bay. All 787 persons aboard were rescued. Our Fire Department played a major role in the rescue of the people on the ship.



### CAMPBELL RIVER FIREFIGHTERS Hot Spots

Campbell River's Fire Department has had to fight many fires over the years. The following two pages show four examples and are some of the more notable in their fifty year history.

ELK FALLS, OCTOBER 6, 1963-Three Engineers were burned in a shower of scalding chemicals when an explosion blew out the side of a 104 foot recovery boiler at Elk Falls Pulp Mill.





THE WILLOWS HOTEL, FEB-RUARY 19, 1963 - Four people died in a fire that broke out shortly after 3:00 a.m. somewhere at the rear of the 60 room Hotel. The half century old landmark burned to the ground within an hour. Damage was estimated at \$250,000. Cause of the fire was believed to be a cigarette or an electrical fault.

**ZANATTA MILL - MAY 7, 1949** - Campbell River's first major fire! A spark from a cutting torch set the blaze. It did not take long, a couple of hours later, all that was left was hot ashes and memories.



**CEDAR SCHOOL - NOVEMBER 25, 1966** - Damage estimated between \$250,000 and \$300,000 when a fire of unknown origin swept through the eight room original building of the Cedar Elementary School complex which housed three hundred pupils.

### **District of Campbell River**

Campbell River celebrates its Coat of Arms, This mark of honour, symbol of Campbell River's status as a community, was granted by the Lord Lyon King of Arms of Edinburgh under the authority granted him by Queen Elizabeth II. The Lieutenant Governor officially presented the Coat of Arms to Mayor Ostler and Council on December 7, 1987.

Each element of the Coat of Arms is an expression of Campbell River's history, geography and economy, using symbols from geography and economy, using symbols from the rich tradition of heraldry described below.

These new arms honoured by the Crown, will serve to inspire and remind all of Campbell River's areat natural heritage and the work of its people.

#### The Shield & Coronet

The shield is the central and most important element. The lower portion symbolizes the meeting of the waters of Campbell River and Discovery Passage and the vital industries of fishing and forestry. In the upper portion or 'chief' of the shield, the Lord Lyon has honoured the town's namesake, Dr. Samuel Campbell, by featuring the ancient arms of the Chief of the Clan Campbell; replacing the black sections in this case with Ermines, a heraldic fur which recalls the early importance of the fur trade. Above the shield is a mural coronet in Canada's national colours, the special sign granted to all District

Municipalities. Above the coronet in the place of honour is the traditional symbol of high status among the First Peoples of the region, the cedar headring to the Kwaaiutl ornamented with abalone.

#### The Supports

In the Coat of Arms are a pair of majestic bald eagles which are termed "the supporters" and flank the shield. They represent the rich natural environment that supports the community and provides such a splendid setting for settlement and recreation. Each eagle is "charged" on its breast with a gold circle bearing a black diamond, the heraldic symbol for mineral wealth which produced another significant economic activity.

#### The Compartment & Motto

At the base of the Coat of Arms is the "compartment" which consists of a grassy meadow embellished with two well-known local plants, salal and Nootka roses. The rose is also the insignia of Campbell River's twin city, Ishikari, Japan. Above the whole design is the motto, "Enriched by Land and Sea", describing Campbell River's situation and fortune.

These new arms, honoured by the Crown with symbols devised from the rich tradition of heraldry, will serve to inspire and remind all of Campbell River's great natural heritage and the work of its people.
