Watering of gardens, trees, shrubs and lawns using hand-watering methods with controlled water flow. This includes: hoses with springloaded nozzles and watering cans.	Permitted	
Filling of outdoor hot tubs, swimming and wading pools.	Permitted	
Watering of lawns, gardens, trees, and shrubs using automatic irrigation with continuous water flow. This includes: in-ground sprinkler systems and above-ground sprinkler systems, and sprinklers attached to hoses.	EVEN-NUMBERED ADDRESSES (RESIDENTIAL): Mondays from 5 to 9 a.m. and 7 to 10 p.m. only.	
	ODD-NUMBERED ADDRESSES (RESIDENTIAL): Thursdays from 5 to 9 a.m. and 7 to 10 p.m. only.	
	EVEN-NUMBERED ADDRESSES (NON-RESIDENTIAL): Wednesdays from 1 to 5 a.m. only.	
	ODD-NUMBERED ADDRESSES (NON- RESIDENTIAL): Tuesdays from 1 to 5 a.m. only.	
Watering of new grass plantings. New seed within 45 days of planting and new sod within 21 days of planting.	restrictions for th	ring Permit issued during Stage 1 ne entire 21- or 45-day period. tering permits available.
Power washing sidewalks, walkways, driveways, exterior building surfaces, or other outdoor surfaces.	Not allowed. Childcare facilities, food and beverage establishments, or animal care facilities may do so when required by health and safety regulations.	
Manual exterior window washing.	Not allowed. With exception to licensed window cleaning services.	
Washing of vehicles outdoors.	Not allowed. With exception to commercial car washes, car dealerships, and vehicles subject to health and safety regulations.
