Join an advisory committee to help meet community needs

Campbell River City Council invites volunteers to join three new advisory committees on community planning, environmental protection and a healthy community, including public safety.

**Be part of the teams that advise City Council on widely-held priorities – to help continue the momentum toward achieving the community's long-term vision for Campbell River.**

The new advisory committees will have nine voting members and one non-voting Council liaison. They will begin their work this fall, providing comprehensive advice to City Council based on the unique skills and knowledge of the committee members.

**Community Planning Committee** – make recommendations on community visioning topics such as long-range planning, transportation, utilities and parks planning, the Official Community Plan and Zoning bylaws, affordable housing, economic and development issues and opportunities, public art, neighbourhood development and downtown revitalization.

**Environmental Advisory Committee** – advise on issues related to waterfront, foreshore and estuary restoration and protection, conservation areas and passive parks, streams and wetlands, landfills, organic waste (composting), energy and emissions, the effects of climate change (storm severity, sea level rise), watershed and water conservation and ecosystem services.

**Healthy Community & Public Safety Committee** – make recommendations on matters concerning community health and social wellbeing, including public safety, downtown security, homelessness and emergency and transition housing (including the extreme weather shelter), assisting social services providers and the opioid crisis.

## DOWNTOWN BIA FAÇADE AND SIGNAGE IMPROVEMENTS PARTNERING AGREEMENT TO BE CONSIDERED BY COUNCIL

Campbell River City Council will consider a partnering agreement to help the Heart of the City Business Improvement Area Association (BIA) improve façade and signage on privately-owned buildings downtown through a funding program.

The partnership agreement and funding would encourage enhancement of downtown streetscapes, contributing to the City's overall downtown revitalization goals.

**The City has \$80,000 available in 2018 for downtown façade and signage improvement projects, and \$60,000 in 2019.**

To receive City funds, the BIA must submit an invoice to the City for pre-approved work performed, and demonstrate upon project completion that the Downtown Façade Improvement Program and Signage Incentive Program design guidelines were followed and met. If and when all works are completed and approved by the City, the BIA would receive the lesser of funds up to \$10,000, or 50 per cent of the total cost of the project. These funds may then be used by the BIA to reimburse the business or building owner carrying out the works.

Council will consider approving the partnership agreement at its regular meeting on July 16, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. The draft partnership agreement is available for public inspection between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, excluding holidays, at City Hall, 301 St. Ann's Road, Campbell River.
