## NEW TRAFFIC LIGHTS, LEFT TURN SIGNALS FOR IMPROVED SAFETY AT DOGWOOD AND 13<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE

A safety upgrade will begin Monday, Feb. 22 at the Dogwood Street and 13<sup>th</sup> Avenue intersection. The work is scheduled to be completed in approximately six weeks.

"This work will replace existing traffic lights and add left turn arrows in all directions at this busy downtown intersection near Fire Hall No. 1," explains Drew Hadfield, the City's director of operations. "The existing signal was installed in 2003 and is now due to be replaced."

Traffic controllers will be on site to direct vehicles while work is underway. Two-way traffic will be maintained as much as possible, but traffic delays and temporary lane closures will be required during construction.

"People should expect minor traffic delays at this intersection during construction and, if possible, please consider using an alternative route," Hadfield adds. "Drivers are reminded to proceed with caution in the work area, and we thank everyone in advance for their patience during this construction."

Other improvements at the intersection include new:

- traffic controller and box
- bases and poles
- street name signs
- traffic signal heads
- LED luminaires
- accessible pedestrian system
- pedestrian countdown timers
- emergency vehicle pre-emption system
- uninterruptible power supply (battery backup)

Daeco Installations Ltd. was awarded \$171,756 for the contract to design and build the new infrastructure. ICBC will provide funding assistance of \$7,800.
