

## **Risk Assessment Process Framework**

| 1 | Vulnerability<br>Assessment                   | This was completed through an online questionnaire before the risk workshop to<br>determine any low-vulnerability impacts that could be removed, and to identify<br>any missing impacts or gaps. The impacts that move forward from the<br>vulnerability assessment are brought to a risk assessment workshop.  |
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| 2 | Risk<br>Assessment<br>Workshop                | This workshop brings together a variety of internal stakeholders and community<br>partners to collectively assess risk (through a function of likelihood and<br>consequence). The purpose of this broad and inclusive risk assessment is to<br>bring together a variety of perspectives with a variety of expertise working across<br>all urban systems (built, natural, social, economic).   |
| 3 | Post-Workshop<br>Analysis                     | The completed worksheets from the risk assessment workshop are reviewed by<br>ICLEI staff. Any impacts that were not reviewed by a table require further<br>attention, as well as any impacts that received a score of 1 or 5 (lowest or<br>highest) in any category. Often these are impacts that received a low score in<br>the "environmental criteria" portion of the consequence tables.   |
| 4 | ldentifying<br>Subject-Matter<br>Experts      | ICLEI works with our local contact to determine who we should contact for more<br>information on the impacts/risks that require further attention. This may be<br>someone within the municipality who understands that impact and the<br>consequences it might have, or it may be someone working locally or within the<br>broader region or province with an understanding of a particular issue.  |
| 5 | Additional<br>Risk<br>Assessment<br>Meetings  | ICLEI staff will then connect with the identified subject matter experts to discuss<br>the identified impacts/risks. These meetings will be an opportunity to present how<br>the risk was analyzed to date and what outstanding questions remain relative to<br>the impact. The expert will weigh in on the consequence of that impact from their<br>perspective and offer their opinion on what the consequence ranking of that<br>impact could be.                          |
| 6 | Analysis of<br>Risk<br>Assessment<br>Findings | ICLEI staff will combine the results of these additional meetings with those from<br>the initial risk assessment workshop. This will be done in concert with the<br>municipal partner who can weigh in on whether anyone else should be consulted<br>before determining the final risk score. Another round of risk assessment<br>meetings can occur at this point if there are still outstanding questions or<br>concerns related to the risk ranking or consequence scores. |
| 7 | Final<br>Presentation of<br>Risk Ratings      | The final risk rankings will be compiled in a report that highlights the highest ranking risks, and includes a full list of risk ratings. The highest ranking risks will move forward into the planning stage, which will take place in the fall.   |
