

Identification required to register to vote on Election Day

Any person who is eligible to vote and is not registered may register at the Advance polls or on General Election Day.

Acceptable identification includes:

- BC Driver's Licence
- BC Identification Card
- Photo BC Services Card
- Certificate of Indian Status as issued by the Government of Canada
- Non-photo BC Services Card
- Social Insurance Card
- Passport,
- BC CareCard or BC Gold CareCard, (please note the combined drivers licence and care card are one piece of identification),
- Ministry of Social Development and Economic Security Request for Continued Assistance Form SDES8
- Credit Card
- Debit Card
- Vehicle Insurance,
- Birth Certificate,
- Citizenship Card,
- Statement of Employment Insurance Benefits
- BC Government cheque,
- Income Tax Assessment Notice,
- Canadian Forces Identification,
- Old Age Security Identification Card,
- Property tax notice or
- Utility bill such as hydro, gas, telephone, cable, showing residential address
- Picture identification is not necessary

Non-Resident property owners must provide proof of ownership of the property in the form of a Certificate of Title.
