WHEREAS: Each year, workers and employers, family members of fatally injured workers and representatives from all levels of government are invited to participate in the *Day of Mourning* to honour the memory of lost workers and to increase public awareness of occupational health and safety;

AND WHEREAS: The loss of life at work is tragic and preventable, and through observing the *Day of Mourning*, we honour those who have died and remind our community to renew their commitment to ensure all workers are safe on the job.

AND WHEREAS: In 2025, 138 workers in British Columbia died from a workplace injury or disease;

AND WHEREAS: The *Day of Mourning* was initiated by the Canadian Labour Congress in 1984, and Canada was the first country to formally recognize this day, now observed around the world;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT I, Kermit Dahl, Mayor of the City of Campbell River, do hereby proclaim April 28, 2026, to be:

“DAY OF MOURNING”
